



#### The opps' double modifies the bids of the responder.

The responder can freely pass with a weak hand and a 2-level suit shift is weak It shows less than 10HCP.

- Support bids show a fit and less than 10HCP
- Redouble and 2NT Truscott enable you to bid handss with more than 10HCP
- 1NT is a natural bid, with 6-10HCP
- A suit change is round forcing at level 1 et non forcing at level 2



Problem E4809 PASS with this poor hand!



Problem E5002 Minimum support bid with 7HCP and a 3 card fit.





## Responder's support bids after a 1 level opening major bid

- simple support with a 3 card fit and 5-7HCP
- A jump with a 4 card fit and more than 7HCP



Problem E5003 Game Invite with a very nice 9HCP



Problem E5004 Bid Game with a strong 11HCP





## With more than 10HCP, make the bidding sequence forcing:

With a fit

- of 3 cards in the opening major: XX
- of 4 cards in a major opening (and 5 for a minor): 2NT Truscott
- of 44 cards in a major opening and a nice 5 carder : Jump fit in that suit ('Meet me' jump fit)

#### Without a fit

- Suit change at level1, round forcing
- With a balanced hand and stoppers in all other suits 3 NT
- Without any other possible bid: IRedouble



Problem E4806 After Opp's X on P's major opening, XX promises approx 10HCP and a 3 card fit.





With less than 11HCP and no fit

- Suit shift at the 2 level; faibles et non forcing. In general they show a nice 6 carder
- 1NT with no biddable major and no fit: This weak bid ne does not guarrantee stoppers in the suits called for by the opps' double.

Reminder: A suit shift at the 1 level does not deny 11+HCP and is round forcing



Problem 5779 2 • Suit change at the 2 level shows a • misfit and searching for an alternative contract. It's a weak bid, non-forcing.
