## The dealer's overcalls after an initial pass and two adverse bids.

You need an interesting hand of $8-10 \mathrm{HCP}$ with the high cards concentrated in the two other suits. The main overcalls are:

- Double, which guarantees 8 HCP and 4 cards in the other two suits.
- 1NT which promises a two-suiter in the other two suits.
- Cue bid of the minor opening promises a two-suiter 5-5 in the other two suits.

## The double

This is a takeout double calling for the other two suits. It guarantees:
At least 8 HCP and 4 cards in the other two suits.
You started by passing so your Partner knows that your double isn't as strong as it would have been in the first round.

With 8 HCP and 4 cards in the other two suits, action is needed!

## The dealer's bid after an initial pass and two adverse bids

## 1NT after an initial pass.

This bid is conventional and shows a two-suiter in the other two suits. If these are the major suits, it's because there were four spades which prevented a weak two opening. The two-suiter is therefore $6-4$ with the six-card suit being always the lowest ranked.If these are the minor suits, the two-suiter could be 6-4, 5-4 or 5-5 in a hand too weak for the cue bid.
