Problem E2007 PASS with this awful hand !



Problem E2015 The 1 NT response has the advantage of preventing the opponents from making a Major overcall at the 1 level. It shows 7 to 10 HCP

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Responding with a new suit at the 1 level

- Required strength: 5 to 10HCP and a 4+ card suit.
- With a 5 card Major: bid it (in general)
- With 6 cards in : bid it
- With 5 cards in \blacklozenge , 4 4 in the Majors, and a nice hand, bid 1 \blacklozenge
- with more than 1 4 card suit, and
 - $\circ~$ a weak hand: give preference to the cheaper suit (not necessarily a Major !)
 - an 'average' hand (8-10HCP) bid the cheapest Major
 - a strong hand, prefer the minor(+) .



Problem E5268 If you do not bid in the first round , you risk never having an opportunity to bid them and missing out on a fit (and possibly a slam)



Problem E5269 With 6 cards in + you must bid them, even if you have a 4 card Major.

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Preempt response bids

On a minor opening, they can be used even with a very weak hand (3-4HCP).

- with a nice minor, prempt at the 3 level
- With ♥, go to the 4 level to make the job of the opponents more difficult.



Problem E5271 An excellent preempt that really complicates the task of the opps !

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Support bids

Support may be the only possible bid.

- Simple support with 5 to 10 support points
- Jump support with 11-12 support points . it is an encouraging support for a NT contract .



Problem E2029 minor support at the level of 3 is not forcing. It shows 11 - 12 support points. it denies a 4 card major

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
