

## Responder's 2nd bid after a 1NT 1st response bid. Opener's minimum 2-suiter bid for the majors

Opener can have between 11-17HCP.., the Responder has 5-10HCP maximum.

- If Responder is minimum in his bid, Game isn't possible. : need to find the best (sometimes the least bad ...) contract.
- Maximum, with 10HCP, the Responder bids 2NT ; he has stoppers in the other 2 suits. Opener signs off in relation to his strength with pass or 3NT.
- Other bids are : support bid of the 2 nd suit, preference bid for 1 st suit, a new suit or an impossible bid!


Problem E5351 Here, Responder is maxi with 10HCP and has stoppers in the minor suits. He invites game by bidding 2NT

## After an economical 2-suiter and a 1NT 1st response : level 2



## With less than 10HCP and no fit : Responder knows that Game isn't a possibility. Therefore he's looks for the best part-score contract.

- Pass of course with 3 cards in Opener's 2 nd suit, a singleton in the 1st and less than 10HCP
- Returning to Opener's 1st bid suit this bid means preference for the 1st bid suit and shows 2 cards

Be Careful With only 7 trump cards, choose a 5-2 distribution rather than a 4-3. So in this case, always come back to Opener's 1st bid suit.


Problem E5353 2a, preference bid even with 3 nice cards in the 2 nd suit, you need to support bid the 1 st bid suit.


Problem E5357 PassWith a singleton in the 1st suit and 3 cards in the 2 nd suit.

After an economical 2-suiter and a 1NT 1st response : level $2 \square 14 \mathrm{D}$

## With 10HCP and a fit in the 2 nd suit, Responder invites or goes to Game..

- Responder who has 4 cards in the 2 nd suit and $8-9 H C P$ invites Game with a support bid at the 3 level
- With more trump cards and a special distribution Responder jump bids to Game


Problem E5355 3 With $4 \vee$ cards, support bid. If Opener is maximum, he'll bid Game.

## After an economical 2-suiter and a 1NT 1st response : level 2



## With special distributions ....

- With 6 or 7 cards in a minor suit don't leave your P on $2 \boldsymbol{\text { ...bid }} 3 \boldsymbol{2}$ or 3 . In general, Opener will pass understanding it's a misfit. He shouldn't then bid 3NT because communications will often be totally impossible.
- With an exceptional hand making Slam possible, bid a nonsensical bid... This bid won't make sense because of your 1NT 1st bid. eg. 3a or 3NT are clearly nonsensical bids promising an enormous support fit in the 2 nd suit and Slam possibility.


Problem E5359 Don't give up on your P with only 6 trump cards on your side.. 3 is probably the least bad contract for your team.
