



Le Lebensohl convention is used by the responder, after his partner opened 1 NT and an overcall by the opps. we describe here a simple version of the domeontion which is not used in Ibridge exercises.

- If you have enough strength to bid game and a stopper in the opps suit : your response is a cue bid (Stayman), 3 SA (without a card Major), or bidding a suit at the 3 level (with a card Major or a) card minor
- Without a stopper in the opps' suit bid 2 NT forcing bid transfer for ♣, or a suit at the level (natural bid, weak)
- Finally, a double is punitive/li>



Problème E5617

2 NT that shows the lack of a stopper in ♥



Problème E5618

3 SA that shows the ♥ stopper and enough strength to play game (and debies 4 cartes in ♠).





The 2 NT bid

It shows:

- An ambiguous strength , Game is possible, but not certain.
- and, a lack of stopper in the suit of the overcall

After that bid, will rectify to 3♣ and the responder will :

- Pass with 6 cards in &
- bid 3 ♦ with 6 cartes in ♦
- Cue bid = Stayman
- bid 3 ♥ ou 3 ♠ : naturel avec 5 cartes
- bid 3 NT, natural ...without a stopper in the suit of the overcall.

3 ♥ Stayman for ♠



Problème E5623

PASSGame is unlikely...





With a stopper in the opps's suit and strength to bid game

as if the opps had remained silent you will investigate what the best game is

- The cue bid is a Stayman
- 3 SA to play them
- 3 level bids are natural and forcing: they show 5 cards in the Major or 6 cards in the minors



Problème E5619

3 ♠ Forcing, the opener will conclude at game: 3 NT with the ♠ fit, or 4 ♠ with the fit.





Xith a weak hand

With no possibility of a competitive bid...you must pass!

Otherwise: you can bid at the 2 level with a 5 card suit.Clt is purely a competitive bid and the opener will pass (in general..).



Problème E5620

2 ♠ Non forcing bid that shows a weak hand and 5 cards in ♠ with no ♥ stopper
