## The 2 club opening: strong undetermined hand

## 2 club openings cover several types of hand:

- balanced hands with at least 22-23HCP (super NT),
- third-zone one-suiter hands with a strong suit of at least 6 cards,
- fourth-zone hands with a very strong 5-card major (minimum ace king queen $\mathrm{x} \times$ ).


## Some advice:

Open 2 clubs if you hold the number of tricks for game minus 1


Problème E2508
2 clubs With a magnificent third-zone one-suiter (about 18HCP), open 2 clubs strong undetermined hand. If you open 1 diamond then jump to 3 diamonds that would indicate a second-zone one-suiter (15-17HCP)


Problème E2506
2 clubsAll very strong balanced hands (22-23HCP) should be opened 2 clubs followed by a NT rebid.

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Careful!The $\mathbf{2}$ club opening isn't suitable for two-suiter hands in general and for minor-major two-suiters in particular.


Problème E2510
1 diamondThe 2 club opening really isn't suitable for two-suiters and in particular to minor-major two-suiters.

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## The $\mathbf{2}$ club opening is forcing for a round.

In response the partner usually announces 2 diamonds as a relay or else he gives:

- a very strong major of at least 5 cards headed by two high honors
- a very strong minor of at least 6 cardsheaded by two high honors


Problème E4523
2 diamondsRelay, even with nothing at all. You will pass with alacrity next time round when the opener has described his 2 club hand.

## The opener's rebid after a 2 diamond response.

- With a balanced hand, the opener bids 2NT and the auction continues with Stayman and Texas
- With a one-suiter hand, he bids his suit in general a 6-card suit headed by high honors


Problem E6148 Example of a 2NT rebid by the opener of 2 clubs


Problem E5297 Bid your very nice suit. Your partner will decide the rest : stop, game, slam...
