

## **Ducking**

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This move consists of playing a low card from both hands, in order to facilitate communications between Dummy and Declarer.


Therefore you voluntarily give Opps a free trick.


There are many reasons why you should play this move :

- establishing a long suit
- an uneven suit distribution
- · preparing a ruff
- preparing a squeeze
- ...etc...

Example: You're South playing a 3NT contract. You need to make 6 & tricks and you only have 2 entries to Dummy. You fear that one of the Opps has 4 & cards. What's your line of play?







Exercise Q3985 To ensure 6 & tricks play the 2 & for a low card in Dummy. East who has 4 & cards takes the trick and now only has 3 & cards remaining which will drop under AKQ The probability of making your contract
