## responses to 2NT openings

On a 2NT opening, the Opener promises exactly $20-21 \mathrm{HCP}$ and a regular hand. Sometimes, it's possible to have a 5 card major. Responder passes with less than 4 HCP . With +4 HCP Responder's bids are :

- $3 \&$ with at least one major with 3 or 4 cards : with only 3 cards in a major, you need an irregular hand (void or singleton)
- Transfer 5 cards in a major or 6 in a minor: Opener only rectifies if he has a 3 card support
- 3NT natural, no 3 card major and support to play Game.
- 4\% two-suiter minors and Game forcing
- 4 two-suiter majors and Game forcing


Problem E5987 2: Puppet StaymanWith 3 cards in a major and an irregular hand, use Puppet Stayman to find a major fit.


Problem E5990 3 This is a Texas bid meaning $5 \vee$ cards.

- 3 4 cards in one or both majors
- 3• 5 cards
- 3 ค 5 ค cards/font>
- 3NT No 4 card major


Problem E5993 a Showing a 5 card major : team has a fit.


Problem E5994 3* Showing one or both majors with 4 cards, therefore denying a 5 card major

## Bids on 2NT openings

## Responder's 2nd bid after Opener's 3 • bid.

- 3 - $4 \boldsymbol{a}$ cards (reverse bid so that Opener is Declarer)
- 3ヵ-4■ cards
- 3NT - no 4 card major
- 4\& - both majors with 4 cards


Problem E5992 3^Showing 4 cards.

## Bids on 2NT openings

## Responder's 2nd bid after Opener's 3 『 or 3a 2nd bid.

- $4 \boldsymbol{V}$ or $4 \boldsymbol{A}$ fitted no slam ambition
- $3 \boldsymbol{\bullet}, 4 \boldsymbol{4}, 4$ or $4 \bullet$ fitted and control
- 3NT not fitted

Responder's 2nd bid after Opener's 3NT bid.

- 4\& 6 cards in suit - slam try
- 4 - 6 cards in suit - slam try


Problem E5996 4 Slam not possible, Responder signs off with Game.
