



Michaels cue-bid: 2 CA


Two-suiter (both majors) overcalls after an opening in a minor at the 1 level

After an opening in a minor at the 1 level, the bid 2♦ is conventional. It means :

- a 2-suiter both majors with 5 cards. Generally speaking each one of the majors should have 2 of the big 3 honors ... but not always.
- depending on vulnerability a point count of at least 7-8HCP
- Three-reshoon but uppercope in this which the duality of the majors and vulnerability than your HCP!



Exercise 4401 Overcall with 8CP: all points are in both majors!



Exercise E4403 Pass, despite your 2-suiter: your game is worthless!





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Examples



Exercise E4402 2 • ...even with this enormous hand, a Michael's cue-bid doesn't have an upper limit. With an overcall of 2 •, you are certain to be able to bid again on the next round. If your Opp to your left passes, your P has to bid.



Exercise E5386 With one bid this overcall describes a 2-suiter in the majors at least 5-5 and with an ambiguous point count.

With 5 ♠ and 5 ♥ double isn't recommended.
