



Leading against a NT contract doubled: Opps haven't bid any su

Leading against a NT contract: your P has doubled: Opps haven't bid any suit.

Your P has asked for a lead in a major suit, a priori ♠. But, first of all, you should carefully examine your cards.

- if you only have one or two low-ranked ♠ cards, then lead this suit.
- if you have 5 ♠ cards with one or more high- ranking honors, then your P can't have ♠. Therefore, he is signalling for CO:

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7♠ Opps haven't bid any suit. Double is asking for a lead in a major suit. Here, there is no ambiguity : with 2 low ♠ cards.






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Example. Leading against a NT contract: your P has doubled : Opps haven't bid any suit.

6♥Opps haven't bid any suit. Double is asking for a lead in a major suit. Here, there is no ambiguity: with your Jack 5th in Spades, you know that your P is waiting on a ♥ lead!
