



Cue-bid after a take-out double

After a take-out double : The Overcaller's Partner's cue-bid

A cue-bid in response to a take-out double shows:

- a strong hand of 11HCP or more
- This bid is Game forcing

The "doubler" describes his hand in order to find the best contract.

Exercise 4958 As South bid a non-jump cue-bid to ask Opener to describe his hand in order to find the best contract.



Cue-bid after a take-out double

Jump cue-bid from Overcaller's P after he has bid a take-out double

Jump cue-bid in response to a take-out double shows :

- Both majors 4-4
- and from 8-10HCP

This bid is not Game forcing : if the "doubler" has overcalled with minimum points, he sign off at 3♥ or 3♠.

Exercise 5797 Jump cue-bid showing at the same time both majors 4-4 and 8-10HCP



Cue-bid after a take-out double

Cue-bid at the 4 level of the opening minor in response to a take-out double

This cue bid shows :

- Both majors 5-5
- and ... strength to play Game

Exercise 1019 Cue-bidding in Opp's opening minor at the 4 level always requires a two-suiter major 5-5 minimum
