## Response to a preemptive bid at level 3.

Reminders:

- Your partner is bringing you 5 or 6 tricks in his suit
- Any shift is forcing, except at game level.
- Any raise bid is not a game proposal, but an extension of the preemptive bid : the opener shall pass.

Responding to a preemptive bid is just a matter of common sense :

- Count your tricks
- Choose the right level for the contract. Remember that if you are playing a sacrifice contract, your opponents will double!


Exercise 9969 PASS You can't afford to exchange $7 \vee$ for 5 very ordinary $\uparrow \ldots$

## Response to a major preemptive bid

## Bluffing after a major preemptive bid．

When you feel your opponents may have a game，or a slam in a major suit．．．try to make their life difficult！
－In this case，according to the vulnerability，do not extend the preempt，bid 3 or 4 NT．．．．Indeed ！！．．
－If the opponents double，get back to your partner＇s suit at level 4 or 5．The level depends on the number of doubled tricks you can lose！


Exercise 9978 If you bid $4 \boldsymbol{\bullet}$ ，your opponents might end up at $4 \boldsymbol{\uparrow}$ ．．．If you bid 3 NT and accept to be 4 tricks short，it is going to be more complicated for them！If the opponents double，get back to $4 \vee$ ！


Exercise 99754 NT！Pretend to make a Blackwood in order to play $5 \bullet$ ．．．．What are your opponents going to do ？？
