



Jump pre-empts by responder

The responder after an overcall (and after he initially passed)

In response to partner's opening and after an overcall Jump shifts by responder are weak:

- 4 to 8 HCP depending on vulnerability
- At the 2 level, they show a six card Major
- At the 3 level, they show a seven card suit

Caution !

- If responder has initially passed, his jump is not pre-empt, but a 'Meet Me' bid....
- If the opps have not overcalled, a Jump by responder shows a Major two-suiter...
