



2nd bid by overcaller after a cubid of his partner

a cue bid after an overcall is:

- a request for information to decide on best contract, game or part-score
- guarantees at least 11HCP
- .. but does not show fit (he could be fitted or not).

It is the only forcing forcing response to the overcall : The overcaller must describe his hand further. He can :


- Repeat his suit
- bid NT
- bid a new suit
- bid himself a cue-bid of opener's suit

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
The overcaller repeats his suit

- Without a jump, he shows a minimum hand 8-9HCP and a 5 card suit (generally)
- With a jump, He shows a 6 card suit and an interesting hand



Exercice 9760

After your partner's cue-bid, with a minimum hand, repeat your suit at the lowest level: Your honors in \blacklozenge and \blacklozenge are basically worthless. Your hand's value is closer to 8 than 11HCP!



Exercice 9757

Jump repeat your 6 cards suit. Your partner will bid game. There is, unfortunately no slam !

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
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The overcaller bids a new suit

The bid of a new suit by the overcaller shows a Two-suiter. It does not say anything about strength....He can be weak or strong. His partner must show preference based on his own hand, The overcaller will then either pass.propose game or bid game.



Exercice 9749

After you have bid your two-suiter, vyour partner has shown his preference for \blacklozenge ; With your strong hand, invite to game by bidding 3 \blacklozenge . Your partner will accept if he is maximum, as he is here.





After a Major opening and a minor overcall, and a cue bid by overcaller's partner :

The cue-bid of opener's suit by overcaller

- Denies a 4 card Major
- Denies a stopper in the opener's suit
- but shows a strong overcall...and asks his partner to better describe his hand
-it makes the sequence forcing to game



Exercice 4667

Cue bidin response to your partner's cue-bid : Strong overcall, but no stopper in opener's suit and no 4 card Major.
