

#### New suit trial bid

#### Trial bid: after his partner's raise, the opener names a new suit


The responder has shown support with a simple raise. The opener rebids a new suit... i.e. he is proposing to go to game.

- the opener holds an unbalanced hand
- and is looking for "something" in the named suit. The "something" could be :
  - A shortage (singleton or void)
  - A high honor

This bid is forcing for one round.



Exercise 1694 3♣: game proposal. The partner will go to game if he has some added value in the named suit (♣).



Exercise 5176 3. : Can you help in . ? If yes, go to game. If not, bid 3.



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### Development: when the responder can help in the named suit

The opener is looking for help in the name suit. It may be :

• either a high honor

• or a shortage : void or singleton

The idea is to prevent the opponents from making many tricks in the suit. The responder



Exercise 20249 4♥ Your K ♣ is going to be very helpful...go to game



Exercise 20251 4♥ Your ♣ singleton is so precious! Accept your partner's proposal





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# Development: when the responder can't make any contribution in the named suit

Most of the time, the responder will bid the opener's suit at level 3, and that will be it. Sometimes though, he may show some strength in another suit.



Exercise 20248 3♥ is clearly denying the game proposal : no help to be expected in the named suit



Exercise 20250 3♦: showing an interesting strength in ♦, a maximum simple raise hand, but... definitely no help in ♣!
