



With a 2 weak Major opening bid, your partner indicates a maximum of 10 HCP and a 6 card Major with two top honors. He has already told you a lot: It is now up to you to decide where to go from there.

- With less than 12-13HCP, and without a 2-3 cards fit in his Major PASS
- starting from 7-8HCP and a fit, Show support by applying the Law of Trumps
- Any game level bid is to play
- Any suit change is forcing except is game level is reached.



Problème E1043

With 13 HCP and no fit, Pass without hesitation. The opponennts will probably wake-up much to your delight.



Problème E1042

with 15 useful HCP and 4 cards in trump, soutenez Jump to 4. It is a stop.





Stop bids

With 7-8H and a fit: apply the 'Law of Trumps's

- With 3 cards in trump, prolong te preempt to the 3 level.
- With 4 cards in trump, bid game

With a 2 card fit and a strong hand (15HCP or more), bid game :

- 4 ♥ or 4 ♠
- 3 SA with a regular hand, stoppers in all suits and 15+HCP



Problème 1048

With a fairly weak and and 3 cards in trump, it is advantageous to prolong the preempt to the 3 level .Apply the 'Law of trumps'and make a stop bid. You are not suggesting game, your partner should pass.



Problème E4563

When reponding to a weak 2 ♥ opening, apply the 'Law of trumps' : 9 cards in trump = 9 tricks. If your camp goes down on 3 ♥, there has to be a just compensation : the opponents would have made their ♠ contract.





Forcing bids by responder after a 2 weak Major opening: 2 NT

2 NT shows a minimum of 15HCP and an interesting hand. Cthis bid shows willingness to play a game.. and maybe even a slam. Do not use it uselessly, as it also provides information.... to the opps.

Minimum Ithe opener will repeat his suit at the 3 levek

Not minimum the opener will bid:

- a suit with strength (a high honor) aat the 3 level
- a singleton at the 4 level
- 3 NT with no high honneur annexe or singleton.



Problème E4569

With a "minimum" 2 ♥ bid, the opener comes back to 3 ♥. for you it will be the final bid, your attempt at game will not have born fruit.





Forcing bids by responder after a 2 weak Major opening: Suit changes

Any suit change shows a a nice hand, a 5 or 6 cards suit and normally denies fit.

Rebids are:

- The openerwill support partner's suit with 3 cards.
- The opener minimum and not fitted rwill repeat his suit at the 3 level
- · With a 'good' 2 weak major, the opener not fitted, will bid a strength in another suit or may try 3NT



Problème E4574

A change of suit in response to a 2 weak Major opening bid is forcing. as it would be, in fact, in response to any preempt.
