## Responder's 2nd bid after a 2/1 response.

By the time Responder's gets a 2nd bid the camp may already have agreed upon a trump suit...If it is not the case then the priorities are:

1- to agree on a trump suit by showing a fit in opener's 1 st or 2 nd suit
2- to find out If opener has a 6 carder
3-to try a NT contract with a stopper in the unbid suit
4-The last resort is to bid a 4th suit forcing if none of the above is appropriate ... There's no need to jump, since the partnership is already forced to game.


Problem E40048 2NT Unless partner now shows 6 cards in $\uparrow$, the best contract is probably NT You have the required \& stopper.


Problem E40044: Regular hand with stoppers, no fit; no hope for Slam, just sign off at 3NT...

## If The trump suit has been agreed

By the time Responder's gets a 2nd bid, the camp may already have agreed upon a trump suit.... the priority is then do investigate a potential slam, or to quickly conclude at game.


Problem E40162: With all the controls and 18HCP, jump to RKC Blackwood.. and eventually much higher

## To agree on a Trump suit

there are 3 rebids after the $2 / 1$ response:

1- Bid Support in partner's First suit with 3 cards in partner's suit and any strength.
2- Show Support partner's 2 nd suit If he has repeated it (showing a 6 carder)
3- Support partner's 2 nd suit with a fit (4 cards in a major or 5 in a minor) with any strength...
There's no need to jump, since the partnership is already forced to game.

Problem E40043: 3VShow your 4 cards in $\mathbb{V}$, which you could not bid in the previous round


Problem E40043: By repeating his $\boldsymbol{\Lambda}$, The opener shows a 6 carder. You can now fit him with just 2 cards

## With no agreement on the trump suit

there are 3 rebids after the 2/1 response:

1-Repeat your suit with a 6 carder, hoping for a 2 cards fit in opener's hand or a stopper in the last suit, to play NT.

2- Bid NT With no fits, no 6 carder and a stopper in the last suit
3-A 4th suit forcing


Problem E40043 3 • Partner does not have 3 cards in $\bullet$ but may have $2 \ldots$ and does not have 6 cards in $\uparrow \ldots$ so no fit there


Problem E40048. You cannot support $\boldsymbol{\downarrow}$ with only 2 of them. You cannot support $\boldsymbol{v}$ with only 3 of them. You cannot rebid with only 5 of them. You cannot bid No-Trump without a \& stopper.Last resort time - you bid the fourth suit.
