

The rule of 20

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You have a weak hand in terms of HCP but it is 2-suited and you are wondering if you should open. Marty Bergen's rule of 20 says :

- Add the HCP in both long suits
- Add to that total the total number of cards you have in these suits
 - If the total reaches 20, open
 - If it is inferior to 20 : pass!

In 3rd or 4th position , Marty Bergen proposes opening under the sames circumstances, but with a total of 18. Example :

You are in South in 1st position; Will you open or pass?

Exercise 9635 10HCP only and a poor shape! Honors are scattered. You must pass and wait! The 'rule of 20' confirms your good judgment 10 cards in your long suits and 5HCP only in these suits...for a total of 15.

Exercice 49881

'Marty Bergen's rule of 20' tells you to open (10HCP in the suits + 10 cards = 20 the price is right!)





The rule of 20

In 3rd or 4th position, the 'rule of 20' becomes the 'rule of 18'!

Example:

You are in South in 3rd position; Will you open or pass?

Exercise 4989 1 ♥, yes! 8H only, but 10 cards in your 2 long suits, for a total of 18.In 3rd position, it is enough...
