By bidding 4 the responder shows a 5-5 major 2-suiter and values to play a game, but nothing more !All the opener has to do is choose between $\nabla$ and $\uparrow$

## Choosing the major when they have equal length

## Careful!

When you majors have the same number of cards, choose the one that does not have an Ace; This way, you'll preserve the Ace for the secondary suit and will have a stopper. In case of a singleton lead in that suit, you won't suffer the 'infernal ruff'. Singleton $\vee$ lead taken by East's Ace that plays it back for the ruff.


Exercise $12174 \vee$ The champion's choice, who prefers (with same number of cards) the major without an Ace !
By choosing $\vee$ as trump you decrease the odds of a ruff as you can take the first trick in $\boldsymbol{\square}$.
