## Fourth position overcalls with a two-suiter

## Overcalling in fourth position doesn't obey the same rules as overcalling right after the opener...

Be careful! Your partner has already passed, and may have a pathetic hand! Pay attention to the vulnerability . Green vs Red, you shouldn't have less than: K108xx, KJ9xx, xx, x in the named suits.But, there is no upper limit !

Moreover, biddings have various significations. The meaning depends on the number of suits the opponents have named (1 or 2 ). Have different meanings :

- cue-bid of the opener's suit
- 2NT overcall

NT is calling for the two weakest suits. The opponents have named only one suit !

NT shows a 6-5 two suiter of the remaining suits (the opponents have named 2 suits)

## Fourth position overcalls with a two-suiter

## Overcalls in fourth position : the opponents have named one suit only

- Cue-bidding the opener's major shows a 5-5 (at least) two-suiter: \& and the other major
- Cue-bidding the opener's minor shows a 5-5 ( at least) two-suiter: the two major suits
- \& jump promises a 5-5 (at least) two-suiter: \& and the other major
- jump promises a 5-5 (at least) two-suiter : and the other major
- 2 NT shows a two-suiter :...the two weakest suits !


## Problème E5405

2 \& Cue-bidding the opener's minor suit shows a major two-suiter when the opponents have only name one suit.

## Fourth position overcalls with a two-suiter

## Overcalls in fourth position : the opponents have named two suits

- Cue-bidding the opener's suit shows a 5-5 two-suiter of the remaining suits
- 2 NT shows a two-suiter at least 6-5 in the remaining suits
- Double shows a two-suiter 4-4 in the remaining suits


2 In fourth position, if two suits have already been bid, cue-bidding the opener's suit shows a 5-5 two-suiter in the remaining suits
